LIVING FUTURE SYMPOSIUM 2018 MELBOURNE

On October 11th 2018, the LFIA held its the second Living Future Symposium to bring together inspiring thinkers and doers to define, redefine, examine, and challenge what a 'Living Future' could really mean across multiple communities and multiple industries.

Centred on the theme of 'Generosity', the event commenced with a guided biophilic walk from Dights Falls - a significant site for both Aboriginal and post-settlement history - before arriving together at the Australia's largest multiarts precinct, the Abbotsford Convent

Our keynote speakers, George Bandy Jr. and Kara Keys, encouraged attendees to open their minds and hearts to the possibilities of a Living Future and to be generous in their actions and listening.

The morning was followed by panels, roundtable discussions, and interactive workshops that focused in on the topics of biophilic design, healthy materials, and special projects.

The event was an overwhelming success with participants fully taking the theme on board, being generous with their sharing, listening, and openness to ideas and perspectives. Feedback clearly showed that participants left feeling inspired, energised, engaged, positive, and knowing that they would be supported in their work towards a Living Future.

The Symposium was preceded by the Before-After Party which allowed participants to break the ice and make connections with others in an informal, fun setting. Running alongside the Symposium was the Student UnSymposium where a team of students had a few hours to showcase their brilliance by responding to a Living Building Challenge brief.

A diverse mix of 160 people made up the Symposium, representing more than 90 different organisations. Professional backgrounds included architect, contractor, ecologist, developer, engineer, educator, certifier, manufacturer, supplier, government, student, and various senior sustainability consultants.

The Symposium also considerably increased the reach of the Living Future Institute of Australia. Twitter and LinkedIn both received more than 16,000 unique impressions, and over 100 new contacts were added to our database.

Carbon generated through the Symposium added to 33.2 tonnes, and was offset through a verified carbon standard by Pangolin Associates.


