This project aims to deliver a vital community hub and support the formation a sense of community cohesion by integrating the building with the grounds and neighbourhood as a community campus

Priorities include

1. Not expanding the building, so as to respect heritage, consolidate uses and integrate the community
2. Designating an intuitive internal public realm ambulatory core area
3. Investment in the planning, design and maintenance of the grounds
4. Equal access to public realm (each other), heritage, knowledge and nature

This project reflects the spiritual elements of the living building challenge and amplifies the inherent existing site qualities of sky (light) and water by imagining the campus as a 'string of ponds'* that provides the community access to water

This project hopes that Traditional Owners that share an ancestral connection to Australia's river systems will choose to partner with the project on a holistic integrated grey, blue and green infrastructure outcome
